Voluntary Action Fund – Community Grants

Deadline: 25 August 2016

Thanks to a generous donor, VAF has launched a further one-off round of its successful small Community Grant fund. The fund is aimed at Scotland's smallest community and voluntary groups that make a vital difference to their communities. The grant's focus is on supporting and building the capacity of Scotland's smallest volunteer-led groups, with an income of less than £25,000 per year. Groups can apply for grants of up to £1,000 for a wide range of costs or activities that will help sustain or develop their activities.
