Crohns & Colitis Uk

Crohns and Colitis are the two main forms of inflammatory bowel disease and affects many people. The charity are looking for lead volunteers locally to organise events and social activities, fundraise for local and national projects, educate and share information, campaign for better services and develop relationships with health professionals; all to positively raise awareness of IBD and Crohn's and Colitis UK!

This is an opportunity to get involved at a local level, it is flexible and can be carried out in the evenings or weekends to suit your lifestyle. Volunteers are required to be aged 18 and over.

New Service- Family Mediation Highland

Relationship Scotland is opening a Family Mediation centre in Wick shortly. The centre will provide supported handovers between children and parents no longer together. It offers a safe neutral venue and can signpost to additional services if necessary. They are welcoming Child contact Volunteers to assist at the centre, to welcome families, assisting with activities, make refreshments and help out. FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

Youth Scotland – Cashback for Communities Small Grants Scheme

Deadline: 1 December 2016

Uses funds recovered from criminal activity to support positive activities for young people predominantly aged between 10 and 19. Priority will be given to start up grant applications, and to youth groups applying for the first time.

National Churches Trust – Community Grants

Deadline: 29 November 2016

Community grants offer awards usually of between £5,000 and £20,000 towards projects which introduce facilities to enable increased community use of places of worship. They are interested in a wide range of projects but all will include toilets and catering facilities. To qualify, projects must have an estimated cost of at least £25,000 (including VAT and fees).
